LIVELY TIMES IN KENTUCKY.

MOREHEAD, Ky., June 28.—Humphreys, the alleged Sheriff of the county, to-day shot Craig Tolliver, Marshal of Morehead and leader of the opposition faction, who attempted to arrest him on a charge of confederating for his (Tolliver's) murder. One shot penetrated Tolliver's breast, his hand being shattered and his cheek grazed. He returned the fire without effect. A posse is forming for the arrest of Humphreys and his confederates, who are barricaded in the house of one of the Martins. It is almost a certainty that the war will open in earnest again.
